JESUS CHRIST Said “to whom Much is given, Much is Required” and Luke 12:33-44 “Sell your possessions and give Alms (a donation to the poor). For where your wealth is Stored, there also will your Heart be. The failure in Service comes when the Servant becomes discouraged by the people or impatient with his Master: Luke 12:45-49. “But if that servant (one whose service is received by Christ to extend His work among mankind) should say in his heart, ‘My Master (Messiah) is a long time in coming,’ and should begin to beat (wound the conscience of) the menservants and the maids, (Abuse in Christ’s Church of the Young boy or girl, or minister/King’s attendant) and to eat and drink, drinking even to excess (devour and consume, become drunken); that servant’s Master will come on a day when he is not expecting Him and at an hour that he knows not of (and will discover him), and will punish (scourge) him severely, and make him share the lot (a part due) of the unfaithful (unbelievers, not to be trusted). And that servant who has been told his Master’s

Will (what He wishes or has determined shall be done) and yet made no Preparation (Hetoimazo = make everything ready, as leveling the road to make the King’s way passable. Preparing the minds of men to give Messiah a Fit Reception and secure His Blessings) and did not obey (Perform) His will (of the Purpose of GOD to bless Mankind Through Christ), will receive many lashes. But he who had not been told it and yet did what deserved the scourge, will receive but few lashes. To whomsoever much has been given (entrusted, something to be Administered), from him much will be required (called for); and to whom much has been entrusted, of him a larger amount will be demanded.”
